Next week is one of the most critical we have faced in the process of establishing a better future for Northern Ireland. The challenge is a formidable one, but we can and must meet it.

There was general agreement at the round table meetings of parties which I chaired last week that the week should begin with a meeting of senior representatives of the parties. I am writing to propose that that meeting takes place at 10.30 on Monday in room 144 in Parliament Buildings. Mo Mowlam will be there. I hope you will be able to attend.

I do not intend that this should be a long meeting. But it will give an opportunity to establish a focus for our discussions during the week, and give all parties a chance to contribute. The resolution of the remaining obstacles on the path to a transfer of powers is our collective responsibility.

I propose to keep the meeting small, with no more than two senior representatives of each party. Mo will probably wish to make a few opening remarks, then invite contributions from around the table.
