CHILCOT REPORT ON CASTLEREAGH BREAK-IN

The Government has very recently received Sir John Chilcot's report into the issues arising from the break-in at the Special Branch office in Castlereagh PSNI station last March.

Commenting today on Sir John's report in a written Ministerial statement to Parliament, the Secretary of State, Paul Murphy said:

"In identifying weaknesses in national security arrangements exposed by the break-in, this report makes a number of observations and recommendations.

"There has, over the months, been a significant degree of speculation about who might have been involved in this incident, including allegations of collusion. I can confirm that the review did not uncover any evidence whatever that members of Government agencies were in any way involved in this incident, although the police investigation is continuing.

"The review was also able to provide a satisfactory assurance about the quality of the police investigation, confirming the conclusions of a separate review of the professional quality and standard of the investigation, carried out by the Metropolitan Police Service last year at the request of the PSNI.

"The report came to certain conclusions about how the incident might have occurred and made recommendations about how to avoid any similar incidents happening in the future. I am sure that the House will recognise that I am constrained by the wider aspects and implications of national security from going into any detail on these matters. But I shall be considering the matters raised in the report with the greatest care."

Mr Murphy thanked Sir John and Colin Smith for producing a comprehensive report "which provides a solid basis on which to move forward"

1 Following the break-in at the Special Branch office in Castlereagh on 17 March 2002, the then Secretary of State, Dr John Reid asked Sir John Chilcot and Colin Smith, a former HM Inspector of Constabulary, to conduct a review into issues

arising from the break-in. The terms of reference were to establish:

- how unauthorised access was gained to a Special Branch office;
- · the extent of any damage caused to national security;
- the adequacy of action subsequently taken to mitigate any such damage and to prevent unauthorised access there and in similar buildings elsewhere in Northern Ireland;
- · any wider lessons to be learnt; and to make recommendations.
- 2 The review ran in parallel with the criminal investigation conducted by the PSNI.
- 3 The inquiry was launched on 20 March 2002.
- 4 Given the nature of the review, the report will not be published.
